Without question, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our Fellowship, including our organized service structure, is facing enormous challenges, locally and globally. For many of us, the most prominent example is that, for the first time in the 85-year history of our Fellowship, we are navigating the lack of face-to-face meetings. While we have found creative wavs to allow for the vital interaction between one alcoholic and another, and welcoming newcomers daily, it is clear that the health crisis has other farreaching consequences.

As we all adapt to the present reality of digital meetings, the question now is, "How do we responsibly practice self-support, our Seventh Tradition?" As we can no longer pass a physical basket, we are working to find ways to support the Fellowship at all levels, from our groups to Intergroups and Central Offices, from our Districts and Areas to the General Service Office itself.

The reality is that even though meetings, Twelfth Step services and operations have shifted to a virtual environment, expenses continue to accumulate during this crisis, which underscores the importance of practicing the Seventh Tradition. Through this crisis, however, we have witnessed the many ways in which the entire A.A. Fellowship has come together to provide ongoing support...

Our comfort using virtual platforms to discuss (and vote on) business will serve us well; we will be doing the same at our Summer Assembly, which will be held August 8. At that assembly (flyers are included in this newsletter and are available on the Area website, www.cnca06.org) the morning business meeting will include discussion (and possible votes) on motions to request a pamphlet for the transgender alcoholic and the possible formation of an Area technology committee).

In the afternoon, workshops on a variety of topics of interest to AA members will be held; this will be a major test of our virtual capabilities, with simultaneous interpretation across three concurrently-operating virtual rooms. The workshop topics themselves, which were suggested by members of the Area, will be facilitated by six members of the Area, who will make presentations and then facilitate discussion on these big themes of importance to all of AA. The workshop topics are:

- AA Our Financial Future and Our Options
- Our Tenth Tradition When "Outside Issues" Affect Our Primary Purpose
- Passing it on in General Service Variations on the 12th Step



### Digital AA



A.A. in the digital age has certainly taken on a new meaning in these challenging times. Alcoholics Anonymous is not a

place or an event; it exists in the hearts, minds and help freely offered by its members.

Most recently, Coronavirus (COVID-19) has affected many A.A. groups that normally would meet in-person. The General Service Office (G.S.O.) of Alcoholics Anonymous U.S./Canada, which functions as a repository for A.A. members and groups who are looking for shared experience from the A.A. Fellowship, has some general experience to share regarding this issue.

Some A.A. members have shared that meeting online has been an adjustment and has at times had its challenges. Adhering to state/provincial and federal guidelines, many A.A. members have switched from "inperson" meetings to digital meetings, on platforms such as Zoom, Google Hangouts, Conference Calls, GoToMeeting and What's App, allowing the group to continue to focus on A.A.'s primary purpose: to carry its message of recovery to the alcoholic who still suffers.

In a sense, however, this current experience is not necessarily new for A.A. From its earliest beginnings. the A.A. founders recognized the need to reach beyond the face-to-face transmission of the A.A. message, giving rise to the development of A.A.'s basic text, the book Alcoholics Anonymous. This book and other A.A. materials which are widely available on multiple platforms - digital, audio and video - has literally circled the globe and opened the door to recovery for thousands of alcoholics looking for help. Even prior to this pandemic many A.A. members around the world – whether homebound, living in remote areas, or service members stationed in far-flung places - have counted on participating in A.A. remotely through A.A. literature, phone calls with other members, correspondence by letter or email and meetings online.

While many A.A. members are for the first time reporting the shift from in-person meetings to digital platforms, for many alcoholics around the world, remote connections and digital platforms are how they initially encountered and maintain their recovery in A.A. even prior to the pandemic.

Many A.A. groups have shared with G.S.O. that they are now finding great connection in digital meetings and want to offer that same experience to anyone who has yet to attend their first meeting.
